In the month of March, we had no misdemeanor and no felony crimes reported to the Police Department. Officers were busy patrolling the streets, conducting security checks of Borough and private property, and monitoring traffic.

The Borough Police Department responded to 1 reports of domestic disturbances. Chief Thumm responded to a complaint of open burning in violation of the Borough Ord. The department took a report of disorderly conduct. The Police department responded to 1 EMS call. The department assisted the Berks County Sheriffs and Womelsdorf police with a PFA where weapons were being taken form the defendant.

The street lights at 3rd and Homestead Ave. appears to still have a problem along with the light in the 200 block of Homestead Ave. and 400 block of 3rd street. they all come on never get totally bright go out then come back on. There are 4 signs that read no parking this side in the 300 block of Homestead Ave. that still need replacing. Other calls for police included traffic stops and reported reckless driving on Rt. 183
Officers handled many phone assignments relative to police matters which required no police action.

The Police Department worked a total of 35 shifts covering 270 hours of service. Officers traveled 1034 miles while on patrol and in the performance of their duties. We purchased 92.826 gallons of fuel for a total cost of \$266.50 dollars this is the pump price with all taxes and does not show any discount. While on duty officers conducted traffic enforcement monitoring for reckless activity and security checks of properties in the Borough. The department issued 8 traffic citations, 0 non-traffic citations, and 6 parking tickets. The Police department in the month of March handled 10 calls for service and details.

Police Department activity has been strictly limited due to the health crisis and will remain as such until the Health emergency is over.
